Lee Morissette has been practicing Emergency Medicine in rural critical access hospitals since 2007 in Maine, Wisconsin and Vermont. He is a graduate of the University of New England PA Program obtaining his MPAS, he completed the University of West Virginia Emergency Medicine Program and obtained his CAQ in Emergency Medicine. Additionally, he obtained his Doctorate of Medical Sciences from the University of Lynchburg and completed the Physician Executive Leadership Institute Program conducted by the Heller Center for Health Care Leadership. He is a senior fellow of the Society of Emergency Medicine PA (SEMPA), including executive board member for 5 years and a past President.
